Rules

for the European Bridge Championship in 1938.

I. General Rules.

1. In all matches the difference in scores in each round is to be converted into matchpoints (M.P.) on the following basis:

A difference from	1 —	30 =	1 M.P.
	31 —	60 =	2 »

2. In all matches victory points (V.P.) are used. These victory points are to count as follows:

A match is considered undecided if the difference in match points does not amount to more than one fourth of the number of the hands played. Each team is then awarded two victory points. If the difference represents more than one fourth but less than the number of the hands played, the winning team is awarded three victory points and the losing team one victory point. If the match point difference equals the amount of hands played in the match, or surpasses them, the winning team is awarded 4 V.P. and the losing team 0.

3. The result of the matches to be forthcoming so as to appear immediately after the finish of play.
4. All disputes are to be decided with binding effects by three referees. Protests, if any, in connection with a match — also comprising the mathematical calculation — must be lodged with the tournament manager before the beginning of the following round.

II. The open Team — matches.

A. Qualifying Rounds.

1. At the opening of the tournament the Teamcaptains draw a number. This number shows the places of the teams in the first round. Team No 1 is to play against Team No 2, Team 3 against Team 4 etc.
2. The order of playing in the second round is decided by the scores, obtained in the first round. The team achieving the best results in the first round is placed at the top of the list as No 1. The second best is placed as No 2, etc. The team thus placed as No 1 plays against the team now called No 2 etc. The Victory Points decide the order. If two or more teams have achieved an equal number of victory points, the team is considered the better (best) one that has the best percentual match-point difference. If the result still shows an equality, the team is considered the best one that has won most hands, and in case the teams are still equal, the team is the best one that has obtained the highest score.
3. The team that stands best after the result of the first and second round put together, is now placed at the top of the list as No 1 and is in the third round to play against the second best team, which is placed as

No 2 etc. In the same way the following rounds are arranged.

4. 7 rounds in all are played, each consisting of 32 hands. The order of the teams after the seventh round gives the final result of the qualification match.
5. If the number of the teams entered is an odd number, the arranging League is to muster two teams. These two teams are not to play against each other in any round. Should they meet according to the above rules, the one having the lowest number is to play against the team following immediately after the other team of the arranging country, and the latter team is to play against the next number.
6. The participating teams are bound to take part in all the qualifying rounds. In case a team fails to appear at the match, the team is disqualified, and the tournament committee takes the further steps for the continuation of the match.

B. Final Rounds.

1. The four countries, whose teams stand best after the seventh qualifying round, take part in a final match for the European Championship. Here every team plays against each of the other teams.
2. Directly before the first round lots are drawn to decide the order in which the teams are to meet.
3. Each round consists of 64 hands.
4. If two or more teams have an equal number of victory points after the last round, the order is decided in the same way as mentioned under A. 2.
5. In case a team fails to appear at a match, the team is disqualified and the tournament committee will decide the measures to be taken.

C. Consolation Rounds.

1. The teams beaten in the qualifying rounds play a consolation match. The teams are divided into two groups by drawing of lots. Within these groups every one of the teams plays against each of the other teams.
2. Each match consists of 24 or 32 hands subject to the decision of the Tournament Committee. In other respects the arrangement is the same as for the final rounds.
3. The winners from each group meet for a final match of 48 or 64 hands, subject to the decision of the Tournament Committee. The team is considered winner that has won most matchpoints. In case the teams have won an equal number of match points, the team is considered the best one that has won most hands, and should two or more teams stand equal in this respect, the total scores are to decide the question.

III. Ladies' Team.

1. In connection with the opening of the tournament the order in which the teams are to meet each other is fixed by drawing lots. Every one of the teams is to play against each of the other teams.
2. Each match consists of 32 hands. In other respects the arrangement is the same as for the final rounds of the open teams (H. B.).

Each match will be recorded by special recorders. A copy of the record, showing the hands, bids and results, will be handed to the team Captains after the completion of each round.

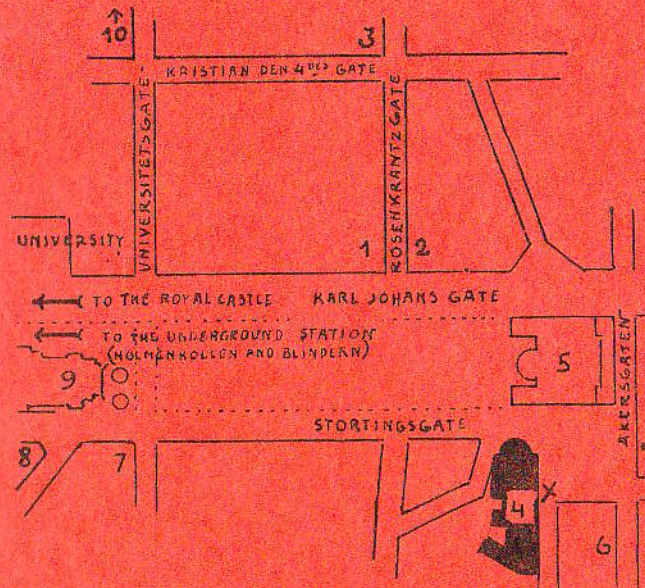
